



Herzegovina's Heritage

Come to Herzegovina, where many cultures meet and create one of the richest cultural heritage of southern Europe. Herzegovina is a magical journey through lands that once hosted Roman explorers and Ottoman invaders. We invite you to come discover the ancient lands that unite East and West.

Whether you're taking a leisurely stroll through **Mostar's historical old town (1)** or admiring the fascinating sights and sounds of the Neretva River that surges under the **Old Bridge**, you'll see why Mostar is the heart of Herzegovina's rich cultural heritage. In Mostar you'll experience a walk through her ancient past, discovering the dozens of handcraft and artisan shops that line the old town. Ottoman architecture is magnificently exemplified in the centuries-old **Koski Mehmed-pasha Mosque**. Just south of Mostar is **Blagaj (2)**, the former seat of Duke Stjepan, who ruled Herzegovina from his fortress perched on a peak above the **Buna River Springs**. The Sultan found this place so magical that he ordered a **Dervish Monastery** built in the 16th century right at the source. It's an ideal place for a relaxing Turkish coffee and an oriental sweet. Only a short ride away, tucked into a hillside, is the famous town of **Počitelj (3)**, a quaint and charming reminder of Herzegovina's past. In all directions from **Čapljina (4)** amazing sites await you. To the south is the largest necropolis in BiH at **Radimlja (5)**, and the Herzegovina Stonehenge at **Ošanići (6)** near **Stolac (7)**. Head north from Čapljina to enjoy a **canoe safari** on the Trebižat River or an ideal family picnic spot at **Kravnice Waterfalls (8)** near Ljubuški (9). Not far from there is the Franciscan

Monastery Museum which hosts the oldest engraved letter in BiH at **Humac (10)**. Nearby is **Međugorje (11)**, the second largest catholic pilgrimage site in the world. Here, in the early 1980's, several young parishioners received a vision of the Virgin Mary and since then Međugorje has attracted millions of pilgrims and visitors.

You won't want to miss the ancient Roman settlement of **Mogorjelo (12)**, located in the town itself. Only a short drive towards the coast is southern Europe's largest bird reserve at the **Hutovo Blato Nature Park (13)**, where you can enjoy a boatride and photo safari. Then, consider relaxing and unwinding in the Adriatic coastal town of **Neum (14)**.

Another don't-miss: Unforgettable nature attractions at **Blidinje Nature Park (15)**, the last primeval forest in Europe in **Sutjeska National Park (16)**, or a raging **whitewater rafting adventure** on the Neretva near **Konjic (17)**. Konjic is also home to traditional woodwork shops that have been passed down from father to son over many generations. There are wonderful lakes for fishing, picnics, and a swim at **Jablanica, Rama and Boračko**. Make sure to stop at **Trebinje (18)**, a beautiful town only a half hour from Dubrovnik. The 16th century **Orthodox Monastery, Tvrdoš (19)**, is open for guests all year round, or visit **Vjetrenica (20)**, famous Karst cave hiding skeleton of a tiger.

We're sure Herzegovina will fascinate and inspire you. Come discover the magic of Herzegovina's cultural heritage.
